DRUMMINROE FAMINE GRAVES

Recently, some locals discovered a famine graveyard at Drumminroe on the Westport-Galway road near the "Goat Hotel" area. Representation will be made to Mayo County Council for help in not only identifying it but also marking it as a sacred burial ground.

According to a survey done by Maynooth College on the impact of the Great Famine, it is noted that Killawalla lost the highest percentage in Ireland of its population to the famine.

'The dreadful reality is beyond yea or nay in this county. From one end to the other the weal has gone forth that the rot is increasing with fearful rapidity. We regret to say no description of potatoes have escaped. One thing is certain, the staple food of the people is gone: and the Government cannot too soon exert themselves to make provision to provide against certain famine' – Connaught Telegraph 1845
